Dear Parents/Carers,

I am writing to you all half way through what has been a really difficult school year for everyone. I don't think any of us expected to be in the position we are in now back in September.

I wanted to personally thank all of you for what you are doing to support your children and your schools. I know some of you are frontline critical workers, supporting the national effort against Covid-19; others are working hard supporting children with learning at home, often with other childcare duties; or working from home yourself too. On top of this, many will have their own personal issues to also deal with. We understand how hard it is, but are extremely grateful for everything you are doing.

At Victoria Academies Trust we appreciate everyone 'doing their best' under such unprecedented circumstances. I am in regular contact with Head Teachers and Chairs of Academy Councils to understand our schools, and ensure that we are supporting as much as we possibly can. What I am certain of is the hard work and determination shown by all staff at Fibbersley Park Academy. They truly are going above and beyond to make sure that they support learning throughout this time. I have spoken to Mrs Sugars over the past week to thank them personally and pass on my thanks and appreciation to every member of the team. I am sure you will agree that your child is fortunate to be at a school where so much care and attention goes into everything that they do. My office base is in a school in Smethwick and so I see first-hand, day in day out, how hard everyone is working.

The future is still unknown, we have all heard the date 8<sup>th</sup> March spoken about by government, but we all wait for further guidance and direction; indeed I hear the news at the same time as you. Leaders have been tremendous this term in reacting to ever changing guidance and circumstances, and I know we will continue to work together as a trust as and when new guidance is released, to make the right decisions about next steps in terms of a wider opening of schools. We all want children back in our schools, but we also want it to be as safe as possible for everyone; children, communities and staff.

I want to try to communicate with you directly as parents at key points during the year, so that you can understand us more as Victoria Academies Trust and as parents and carers of children at Fibbersley Park, feel part of the wider trust.

As you may be aware, we currently are a Trust of nine primary schools across the West Midlands. We are currently working on plans to open Elm Tree Academy, a new special free school for autistic children in Sandwell in September 2022. We were also delighted that the Department for Education has approved our bid to open another free school - Austin Park Primary in the Cofton Park area on the Birmingham/Worcestershire border. This will be a two-form entry primary school with a specialist resource base for children with autism. The school will provide much needed places in a rapidly growing community.


