Keep water beads away from young children

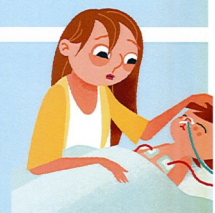


Children love water beads. But it's really dangerous if a young child swallows them.
