



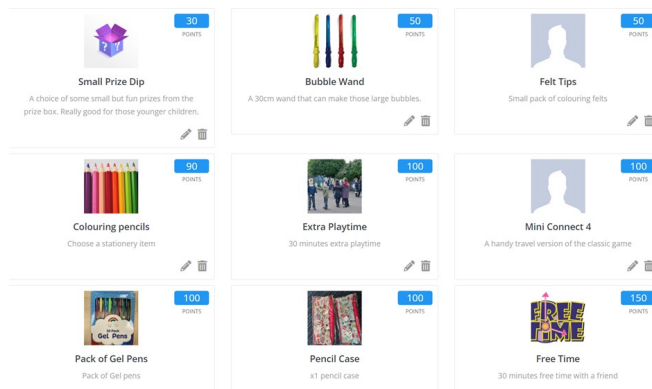

Class Charts

In school we use Class Charts as our main communication system between parents and school and a means of recording your child's achievements in school and any incidents of behaviour that we want to share with you. All achievements are rewarded with class charts points that link directly with our school values. In school we say points lead to prizes. For new families, your child can exchange their points for prizes on the online shop. Click on rewards to see what your child can order and how many points your child has.
