The story so far...

We have had a wonderful first term in Nursery, the children have settled really well into Nursery life, making new friends and exploring lots of new activities. They are trying really hard to follow routines and expectations and they are also becoming aware of our school values, integrity, courage, unity, curiosity and excellence.

Nursery Lending Library:

Reading is an integral part of your child's learning and reading stories to your child helps them to increase their vocabulary, imagination and make sense of the world around them.

Your child will continue to bring home a book each week that they have chosen from our Nursery Lending Library. Please share this book with your child, read the story and talk about the pictures together and share your story reading experiences on Tapestry!

Please return the book in its bag **every Friday** so that your child can exchange for it another book.

Foundations for Phonics: In Nursery we follow a phonics programme called Little Wandle in line with the rest of the school. The scheme for Nursery includes lots of listening games, environmental sounds, oral blending, stories and rhymes to ensure that your child has the best foundation skills for learning letters and sounds ready for Reception. Later in the year, we hope to invite parents into Nursery for some phonic based Stay and Play sessions to join your child in a range of literacy/phonic based games and activities.

Fabulous Figures!

Our nursery curriculum is an approach based around themes and topics which support us to fulfil our mission for every child to 'be the best they can be'. It involves challenges and carefully planned opportunities that are real, immersive and purposeful.

This term we will be learning about the people who help us, '**Fabulous Figures!**'

Children will be encouraged to think about the people who help them in all aspects of their lives including home, school, health and the wider community.

Over the term we will be exploring our wider school and find who helps us in school. We will have visits from crossing wardens, caretakers, a nurse, police officers and firefighters.

Our challenge will be to think about the roles of these people and how we can thank the people who help us, this will be through a range of conversations with visitors, pictures, paintings, thank you cards and photographs which will be presented to our visitors.

If any of our parents are nurses, doctors, dentists, police officers or firefighters or work in the community and would like to visit the nursery children to show and talk about your role please get in touch.

Clothing: Please name your child's belongings, this includes jumpers, cardigans, coats, hats, bags and drinks bottles.

Snack: Children are not required to bring any snacks from home. They will be provided with a snack (fruit) and milk or water from school. Please encourage your child to drink the milk provided. They can bring a clearly labelled water bottle (no fizzy drinks), which they can access throughout the Nursery session.
